“We Matter” Summer Camp 2010 Rules and Policies

Transportation

Transportation will be provided to the camp from specified pick up and drop off locations around James Island, **BUT STUDENTS MUST REGISTER FOR IT**. Rules for riding the bus are the same as during the school year and bus privileges may be revoked if not complied with. If not riding the bus, students must be dropped off promptly by 8:00 AM and picked up at 1:30 PM each day. Students will not be supervised before or after these hours, so compliance is expected to ensure student safety.

Conduct

Disruptions/misbehavior **WILL NOT** be tolerated. Students will be asked to leave campus and will not be permitted to participate in any further session dates.

Walkmans, Disc players, I-PODS, Cell phones, and Pagers

Due to the disturbances created by the above, these and any related items are strictly prohibited on school campus at any time. If found, these items will be confiscated. An effort will be made to return items at the end of each session, but **the camp will claim no responsibility for confiscated items.**

Dress Code

Appropriate student attire includes jeans/shorts, t-shirts, and sneakers. Some activities will be outdoors, therefore comfortable and appropriate attire is necessary. Shorts are permitted but **MUST** be of appropriate length (shorts must reach the end of the fingertips), tightness, and thickness of material.

The following are NOT ALLOWED:

- A. Shorts (daisy dukes, running, and biking shorts)
- B. Shorts with holes
- C. Shorts of thin material that reveal underwear
- D. Spandex shorts, unless covered by regular shorts
- E. Tank tops, halter tops, tube tops, low cut blouses, or tops that expose the midriff are strictly prohibited
- F. Clothing and jewelry advertising or displaying a controlled substance, profanity, or vulgarity are strictly prohibited

Pants must be worn on the hips at the waistline. The waistline is defined as the area where the body bends when leaning over. Accessories that may be used as a weapon or that may present a safety hazard are not permitted. Examples include spiked necklaces or wristbands, dog collars, and jewelry chains that link body parts. Students who are not dressed in accordance with the dress code will be sent to the office to call parents, who in turn, must bring a change of appropriate clothes, or the student will be asked to leave the program. Furthermore, lip rings, tongue rings, “grills,” or any other synthetic materials not prescribed by a doctor are strictly prohibited in, near, or around the mouth orifice and will be confiscated.
